Institute of Social Sciences (TISS), in Hyderabad from May 2011- May 2016 and prior to that she was Dean, Research and Development and a Professor with the Centre for Women's Studies, at the Institute.

Dr Lakshmi is an academic leader, administrator and a well-known gender specialist. In the year 2015, Dr Lakshmi was selected to participate for the Fulbright-Nehru Education Administrators Fellowship programme. She was a Fulbright New Century Scholar in the year 2004-5, exploring the subject of Global Empowerment of Women.

Dr Lakshmi Lingam is on the Curriculum Advisory Boards of several Women's Studies Departments in Indian Universities as well as Technical and Ethical Advisory Board member of NGOs. Dr Lakshmi has undertaken several national and international development research and evaluation studies; published extensively and has travelled widely within and outside the country on academic pursuits. Her broad areas of research include women's health; women's work and employment; globalization, social movements and public policy.

Mrs. C S Ramalakshmi, IFS is former Director General, AP Forest Academy & Centre for Environment, Forest and Natural Resources Management (CEFNARM) Hyderabad. Worked as Additional Prl. Chief Conservator of Forests (Environment Cell), Forest Department, Government of Andhra Pradesh from 31st January 2009 to 24th March 2010. She Worked as Additional Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Production), Forest Department, Govt. of Andhra Pradesh from 15th July 2008 to 31st January 2009. As the Additional Director General (Training Coordination), Dr. Marri Chenna Reddy Human Resource Development Institute, the then Govt. of Andhra Pradesh, Hyderabad she was instrumental in bringing together more than 1,500 environmental enthusiasts through Andhra Pradesh Environment Connect (APEC) and working in the areas of Water Conservation, Energy Conservation, Tree Plantation, Recycling, clean and green villages, and restoration of water bodies and conservation of biodiversity. Focusing in the areas of employment creation, livelihood security and poverty alleviation. She organized 6 million rural poor women in 4,75,000 groups around savings and credit. In early 90's Ms. Ramalakshmi motivated the groups to adopt small family norms for their economic and social betterment and reduce the total fertility rate for the Nation's development. She has organized tree plantation programmes, integrated water shed management programmes, total sanitation in the villages to access safe drinking water and safe sanitation. She has received many awards. Few of the key awards are "Uttamseva Patra" from the Govt. of Andhra Pradesh (1986) for the services rendered to the flood victims of Godavari flash floods in Karimnagar District during 1986 in Andhra Pradesh and the Govt. of Andhra Pradesh (2004) received from Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam, the then President of India, on 19th January, 2004 as the 'Best State Coordinator' for rendering laudable services to the 'self-help movement in Andhra Pradesh' during the period

1993-2004. She has published more than 30 articles on Forest Conservation, Poverty Alleviation, Forest and Tribal Interface, Importance of Non-Timber Forest products for tribal communities, Self Help Groups, Rural markets and rural employment, Sericulture development, Forestry and Climate change, Agriculture, Food security and Climate Change in the various National and International Journals / Workshops/ Seminars and Reports.
